Effective Early Intervention Service Delivery Models and Transition Services for Children Leaving Early Intervention.

Biography :

Dr. Effgen is Professor Emerita and former Director of the Rehabilitation Sciences Doctoral Program at the University of Kentucky, U.S.A. She is an established educator and researcher in pediatric physical therapy and is an APTA Catherine Worthingham Fellow. She has served on editorial boards, including Physical Therapy, and authored the text Meeting the Physical Therapy Needs of Children. She was the principle investigator of a US Department of Education grant studying the relationship of student outcomes to school-based physical therapy. Recently she has been investigating the experiences of therapists and parents in meeting the early intervention needs of young children with disabilities.

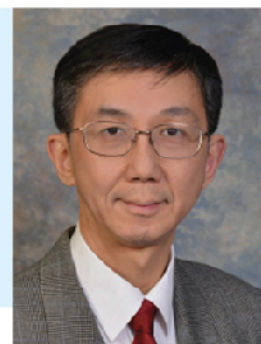
Translating Sarcopenia into clinical practice: why now, why here and making it happen.

Biography :

A/Prof Lim Wee Shiong is the Director at Institute of Geriatrics and Active Aging, and Senior Consultant at the Department of Geriatric Medicine, Tan Tock Seng Hospital, Singapore. He is Adjunct Associate Professor at Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, National University of Singapore; Fellow of the American Geriatrics Society; and Associate Fellow of the Association for Medical Education in Europe. Awarded the outstanding alumni award 2016 from the Massachusetts General Hospital Institute of Health Professions, USA, A/Prof Lim's comprehensive track record of scholarly work included over 160 peer-reviewed publications; editorial board member of international journals; reviewer for major national grants, international journals and conferences; and research and teaching awards in Geriatric Medicine and Health Professions Education. He is a member of the Asian Working Group for Sarcopenia 2019 consensus, and chairs the Clinical Practice Guidelines for sarcopenia workgroup in Singapore.

Fall and fracture prevention for older people.

Biography :

Professor Timothy Kwok has over 20 years of clinical experience in geriatric medicine. He has extensive experience in conducting research in older people and published over 300 papers in peer-reviewed journals. He oversees a centre with daycare and residential care service for people with dementia since 2004 and another centre for osteoporosis care, which heavily involves in community projects and clinical services, since 2013. He has recently completed a community project that assessed fall risk in over 2000 older people and is currently running another project that assesses hip fracture risk in over 4000 older adults

Jimmy has also previously served as President of the Hong Kong Physiotherapy Association, Asia and Western Pacific representative of the World Confederation of Physiotherapy, member of the Physiotherapists Board and Supplementary Medical Professions Council.
